### **Event Results**

Well, guess what! We have no tournament results to report for this month. ### **Next Event**

Each player's drive must be used a minimum of three times. A & B players will play from blue tees; C & D Players will play from white tees. All teams will play scratch.

### **Shanks of the Month**

There has been some confusion about whether you need to complete a new Membership Application if you have already been a member. There should be no confusion; from day one of our MGA, if you are joining for a new year, you always need to complete a new Membership Application. This is the only means we have of assuring that our records are current and correct. Many of you have changes in your contact details during the year and do not notify us of those changes. So, when we need to contact you for various reasons, we cannot do so due to your not having notified us of those changes.

We previously published the listing of "Out of Bounds" markers, "Water Hazard" markers, and "Lateral Hazard" markers that showed the right side of the lake on No. 16 as being a lateral hazard from the right side of the lake to the bridge as being lateral

hazards. Unfortunately, the markers from the right side of the lake to about the front of the green continued to be yellow, indicating a regular water hazard.

It is now my understanding that all the markers on the right side of the lake will be red, thus making the entire right side of the lake a "Lateral Hazard".
